The week...

Dear Parents and Carers,

As we approach Easter we can reflect on a busy and productive term in which there has been much to celebrate. I am grateful for your support in all aspects of school life as effective cooperation between home and school makes a huge difference to the outcomes of our students.

This week is, of course, Holy Week in which we recall the passion, death and resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ. Familiarity with the events celebrated over Easter can dull our sense of awe, but we know that it was the resurrection, above all else, that the Apostles preached. It is remarkable that of those original 12 Apostles, 10 of them were put to death for their belief in the resurrection. The other two were Judas and St John.

Two years ago, our own Archbishop John Wilson, preaching during the Easter Vigil, reflected on the significance of the empty tomb: "Let me suggest to you that, at least in one sense, the tomb was not empty; that it was, in fact, full, and full to overflowing. It was full to bursting with the most powerful 'sign' of God's victory in Christ: 'Why look among the dead,' said the Angel, 'for someone who is alive?' 'He is not here; he has risen.'" The Archbishop finished his homily with a question addressed to all of us who profess faith in Christ: "How will our lives ring out to others with the fullness of Easter Joy?"

Once again, I thank you for your support over the term, and I wish you and your families every blessing in this most joyful of seasons.

The new term starts at the usual time on Monday 15 April 2024.

Teaching idea of the week

Mother's day is a time to celebrate those who raised us, however for some students this can be a challenging time, a reminder of those they have lost. Below are some suggestions of what schools can do:

What Schools can do? Preparing for loss and bereavement

Normality
For the majority of CYP whose life has been turned upside down the routine of school can give a sense of normality. Everything else may have fallen apart but school and the people within it can offer a sense of security and continuity.

Relief from Grief
Often, school can provide relief from an emotionally charged atmosphere at home. They may feel overwhelmed by a grieving family or find it hard to cope if there is a stream of visitors expressing their own grief.

An Outlet for Grief
When a parent or sibling has died, CYP can sometimes try spare their surviving parent by hiding their own grief and appearing to be ok. School is often seen as somewhere safe to express this grief.

Remember
You might feel reluctant to initiate what you perceive to be painful conversations due to a fear of making things worse. However, children and young people are clear about the benefits of support and communication around bereavement and loss in schools. Speak to your SMV regarding referral or further support.

What Schools can do? Preparing for loss and bereavement

A Listening Ear
Family members struggling to deal with their own grief can overlook children. For a child who wishes to school staff can provide an opportunity to talk about what has happened with a familiar and trusted adult in relative peace and calm.

The Opportunity to be a Child
Even when deeply sad, children still need to be children. School offers the chance to play, laugh, sing and generally just be a child without feeling guilty.

General Support
Systems should be in place to keep in contact with home. Discuss concerns but also successes. Grieving CYP can display altered behaviour in different situations. Good communication will help provide a more realistic picture of how the child is coping.

Remember
Take care of yourself

Talking to a child or young person about the death of someone close may be among the hardest things a teacher will ever have to do. Do what you can to support the child, without expecting too much from yourself and speak to someone if you need support.

Who is it for?

Students in Year 9 who are interested in finding out more about STEM careers.

What is involved?

- A three-day experience at STEM educational providers and STEM companies local to them
- Students will explore STEM careers, participate in interactive workshops, site tours and hear from young professionals

What are the outcomes?

- Gain first-hand information and experience hands on activities at STEM educational providers and companies to make informed decisions about their future
- Go on campus tours and get thinking about future studies in a mature and informed manner
- Speak with apprentices/graduates about their experiences
